FUNDING STREAM: Sports Premium

Key aims:

- Establishing partnerships with an Outdoor and Adventurous specialist to improve the delivery of Outdoor education in school.
- To work with Blackpool Community Trust on providing extra curriculum clubs and CPD for staff.
- Forging links with local PE teachers to develop sport tournaments, festivals and competitions for pupils of all ages.
- To provide CPD opportunities throughout the year for staff
- Replenish sports equipment in school to ensure teachers have the resources needed to teach high quality PE lessons.
- To establish more sports team across a variety of different sports. This will enable the children to then take part in their chosen sport at a level 1 or 2 event through the school games calendar.
- Provide pathways to local sports clubs

Blackpool cricket club will be delivering 2 breakfast clubs on a Monday and Tuesday morning for the academic year working with 60 children from KS1 and KS2 on a variety of different skills and games. A member of staff will also be working with the coaches to enhance their on CPD.	£2000

Impact

Outdoor and Adventurous Activities with specialist providers has allowed us to further improve the delivery of outdoor education adventurous trips. Experiences have been provided, around the North West (Beacon Fell, Pendle Hill), for the children would not normally experience in these types of activities. The activities ranged from attending indoor climbing centres, fell walking and orienteering. Team work and resilience has been built upon, as well as the children learning new skills such as den building and orienteering.

144 children took part in 6 activity days of which 29% were pupil premium. Blackpool Cricket Club training and clubs allowed CPD (continuing professional development) for staff. As a result of this CPD cricket club run in house run by 3 Roseacre staff commenced in Sept 2019 accommodating 30 – 35 children each week.

A qualified coach delivered P.E to years 3 and 5 alongside teaching staff.

To date Roseacre has entered a total of 18 competitions from the 20 target that was set over the academic year.

A daily mile activity track that was laid in the playground previously is accessed daily in school by more than 100 children each day. In addition to these figures children are being encouraged to use this resource during clubs for warm ups and at play and lunchtime breaks to encourage children to become more active.

Year 6 visited Chill Factore for an adventurous trip, 90 children attended the day covering a variety of different activities including climbing and skiing. This has encouraged further visits with family and friends.

Transport was provided in July to allow 180 children to attend Stanley Park's Athletic Stadium to participate fully in a competitive sports day. An opportunity to compete on a full 400m running track and participate in field events opened pathways for children to experience competitive athletics.

PE subject lead has completed a stock take of current equipment in school restock as necessary.
